New York Giants Superbowl XLII Champion Lawrence Tynes to Host Fundraising Golf Tournament

New York Giants kicker and Superbowl Champion Lawrence Tynes has not forgotten his roots despite his stardom and notoriety. He returns to the Emerald Coast of Florida where he attended high school to host a fund-raising golf tournament to benefit the Santa Rosa Kids House of Milton, Florida. The event is scheduled for Friday, July 11 at the Tiger Point Golf Club located on the Santa Rosa sound in Gulf Breeze, Florida. The event starts registration at 10am with a 1pm shotgun start.

The Santa Rosa kids House, the recipient of net proceeds from Mr. Tynes event, is a non-profit corporation whose mission is house a variety of agencies that investigate, prosecute and deal with the emotional and psychological aftermath of childe abuse in and around Northwest Florida.

The event is scheduled to have other local celebrities attend the event at Tiger Point Golf Club. An auction of unique sports memorabilia will follow play along with a dinner. Tiger Point, the premier club of the four Meadowbrook owned golf clubs on the Emerald Coast Golf Trail, was chosen by Mr. Tynes and the Santa Rosa Kids House because the golf course was voted "Best of the Bay" by the Pensacola News Journal, it has a brand new 260 seat clubhouse complete with a full service restaurant and lounge as well as a fully stocked golf shop, and Meadowbrook's commitment to assist non-profit groups with generating a higher net income for the event.
